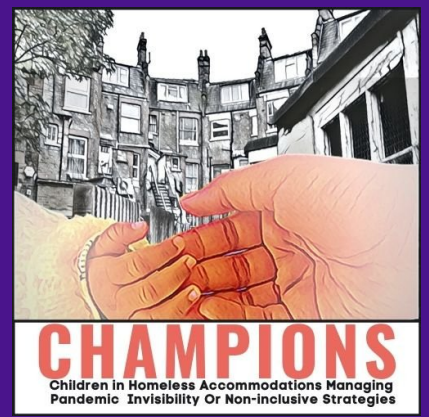


ALL ABOUT CASH TRANSFER INTERVENTIONS



CHAMPIONS looked for cost-effective real world evidence from LMICs to reach children under 5 in temporary accommodation in the **UK**

Cash transfers - money given to families to help with costs

- **Conditional (CCT)** - have to do something for the money like getting child vaccinated
- **Unconditional (UCT)** - no requirements

30% - 80%

JSY, an Indian CCT, resulted in a 3-8% point increase in vaccination coverage

In **Brazil**, CCT resulted in lower infant and neonatal mortality rates than community health programmes due to:

- Higher **immunisation coverage**
- Improved **financial security**
- Improved **basic living conditions**

Chile Solidario programme

UCT + Social worker support
=

More **preventive health** visits for children <6
More **pre-school enrolment** for children 4-6
More families **enrolling in housing programmes**

Comparing CCT & UCT in **Zimbabwe** showed similar results for completed vaccination in under 5's
