CHAMPIONS looked for cost-effective real world evidence from LMICs to reach children under 5 in temporary accommodation in the **UK**

Community Health Workers (CHWs) providing services in the community come in **four types**:

- Intermittent use of minimally trained unsalaried workers for highly specific targeted activities
- Unsalariated workers for regular activities
- Workers with 1-11 months of training who receive a salary
- Workers with 1 year or more training who are salaired

In an **Indian** state:

28% → **69%** Increase in treatment of **Malaria**
34% → **70%** Increase in **Malaria** testing in febrile cases

For refugees in **Bangladesh**, the uninterrupted supply of paediatric medicine was critical for **CHW** services

In **Nigeria**, Preventant3 coverage increased by nearly threefold and coverage of ops infants increased:

44% → **76%**



In **Kenya**, a programme involving CHWs led to an increase in infant vaccination coverage by 10.1% from a baseline of 88.7%
