CHAMPIONS looked for cost-effective real world evidence from LMICs to reach children under 5 in temporary accommodation in the **UK**

We found **7** main strategies

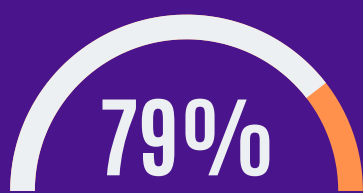
Financial Interventions:

- **User-fee removal** - helping with cost of accessing services
- **Cash transfer** - giving families money with or without conditions
- **Community-based health insurance** - community members pooling money to meet health costs
- **Performance-based financing** - facilities being funded based on quality and quantity of services

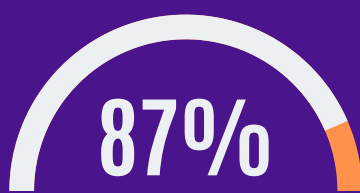
Non-Financial Interventions:

- **Mobile outreach services** - teams of health professionals travelling to communities
- **Community-based primary healthcare** - healthcare workers working in communities
- **Mobile health technology** - using mobile phones and apps to reach people

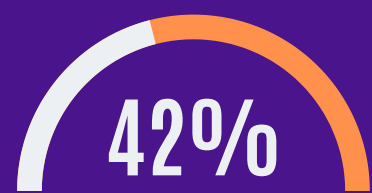
They had results like this:



Lower risk of TB



Fewer new TB cases



Fewer TB cases overall

In an **Indian** state:

28% → 69% Increase in treatment of **Malaria**

34% → 70% Increase in **Malaria** testing in febrile cases
